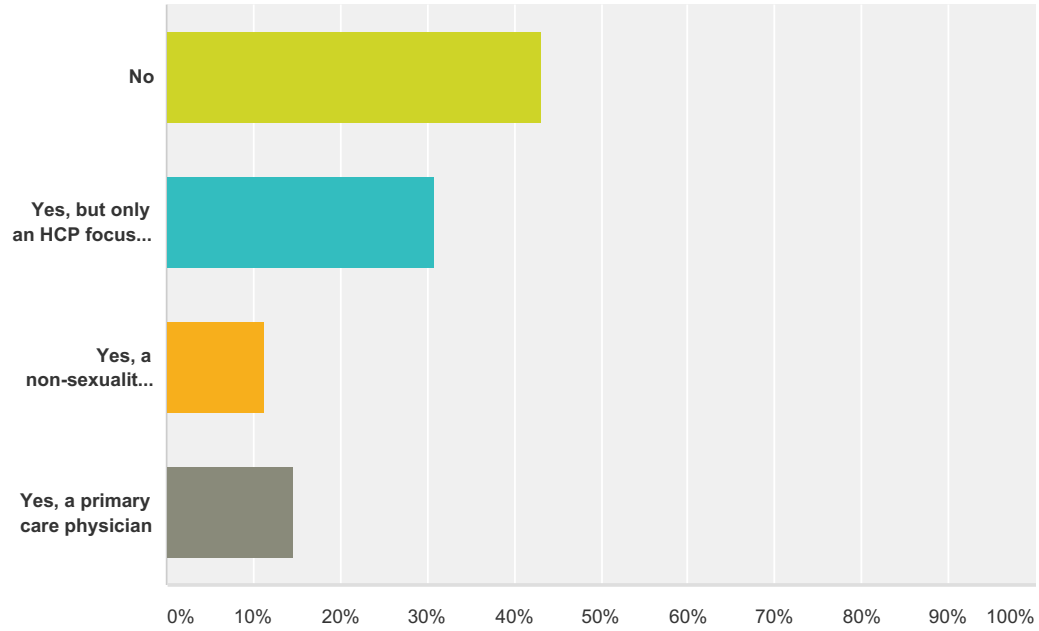


Q1 Have any of your physicians or other healthcare providers talked to you about sex or sexual issues?

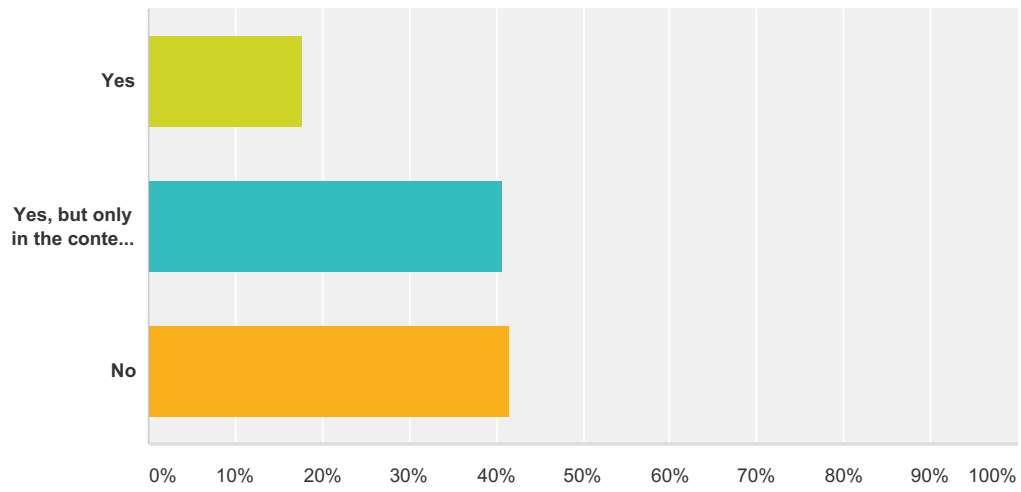

Q2 Do your HCPs seem comfortable asking you questions related to sex?

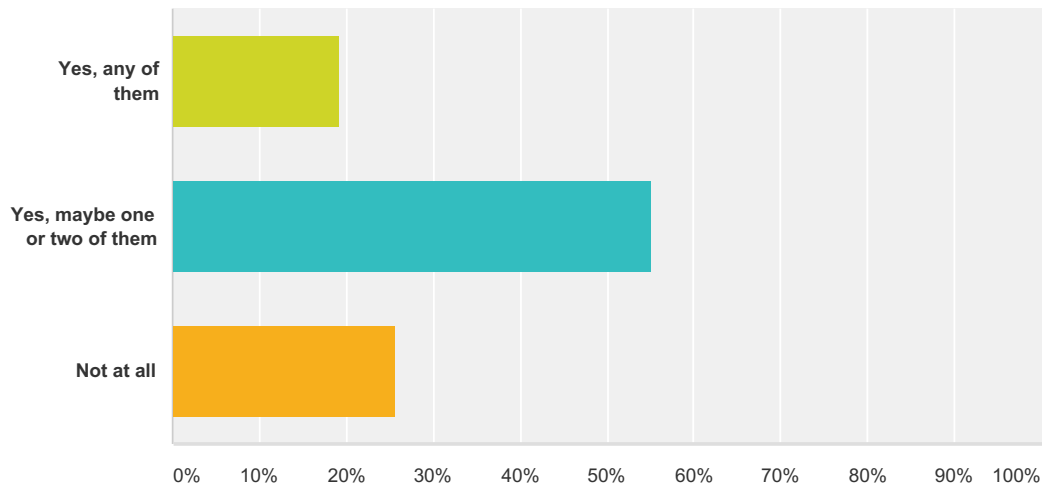

Q3 Do you feel comfortable asking your HCPs about sex/related function?

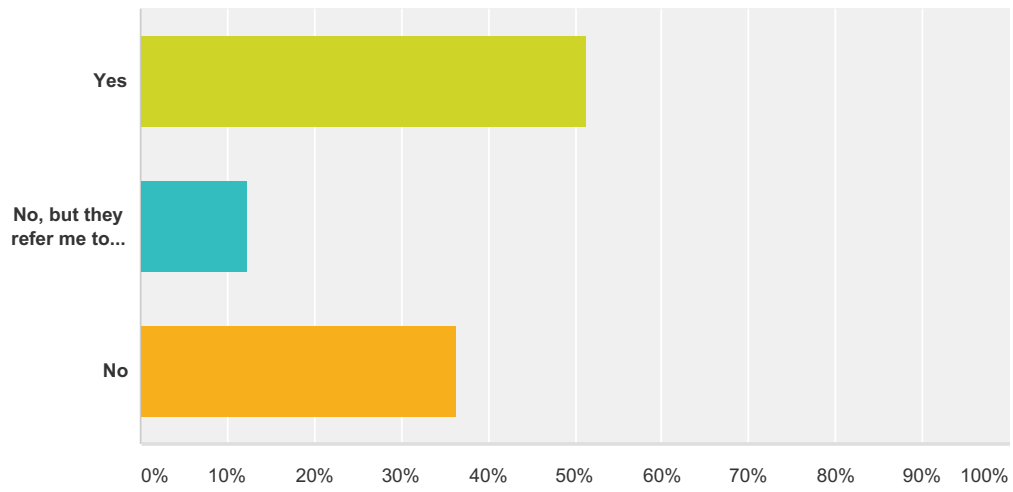

Q4 Do your HCPs try to answer questions you have about sex/related things?

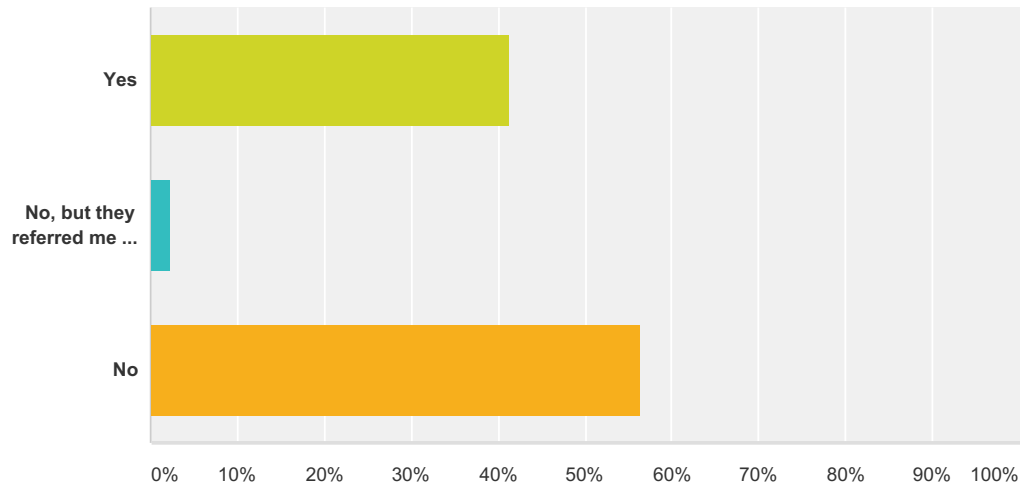

Q5 Have any HCPs discussed effects on sex or fertility your medications or treatments may have?

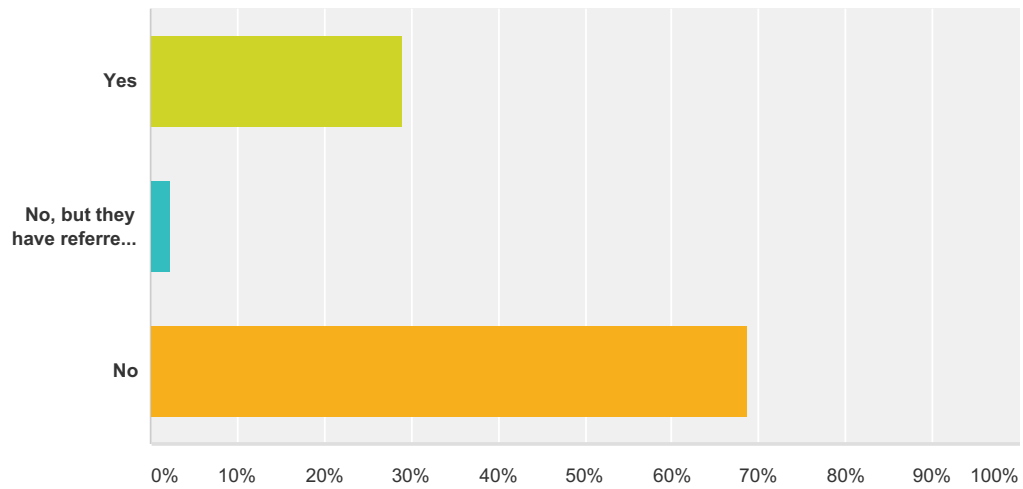

Q6 Has any HCPs discussed effects on sex or fertility your diagnoses may have?

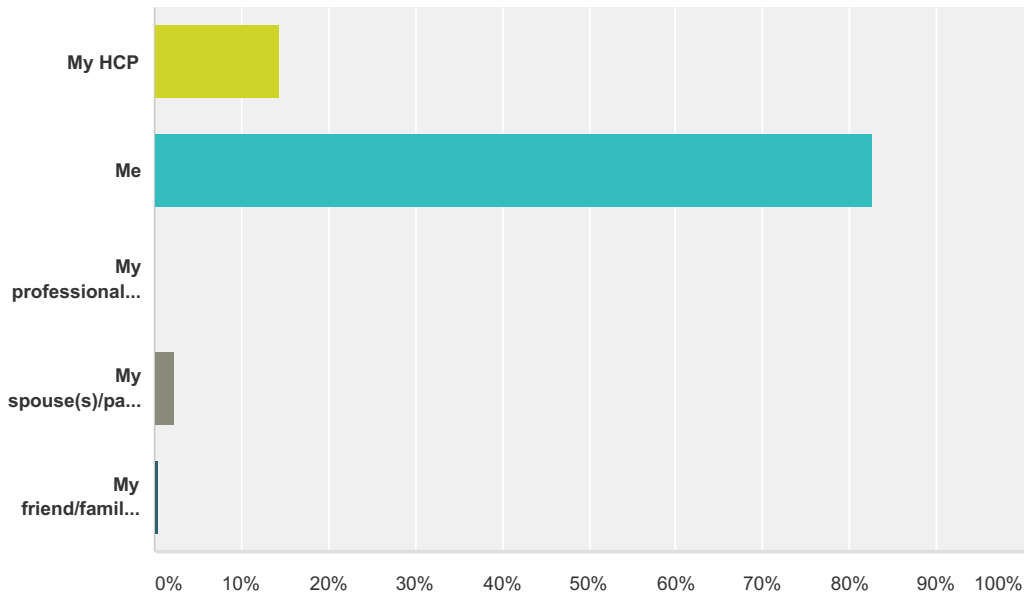

Q7 When sex or sexual issues are discussed in an appointment, who usually brings it up first?

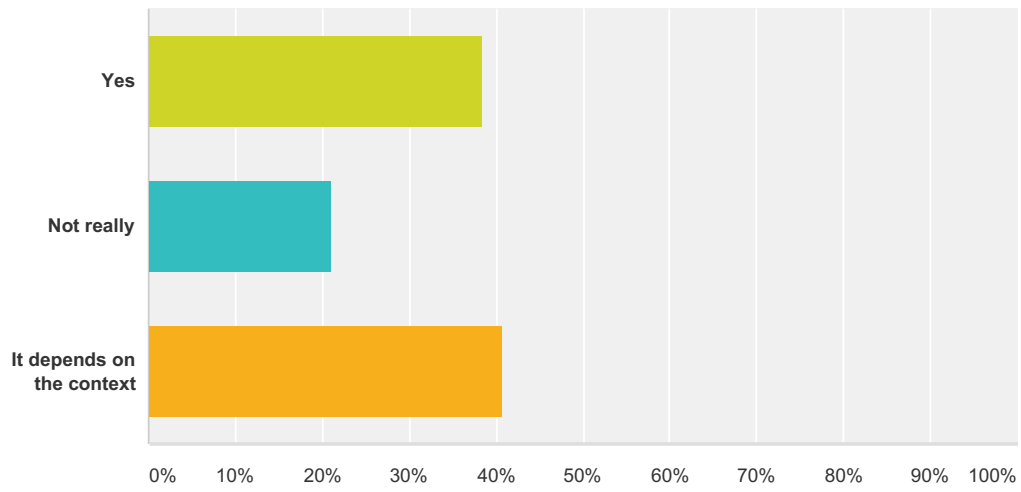

Q8 Are your HCPs receptive to hearing concerns about your Quality of Life (QOL)?

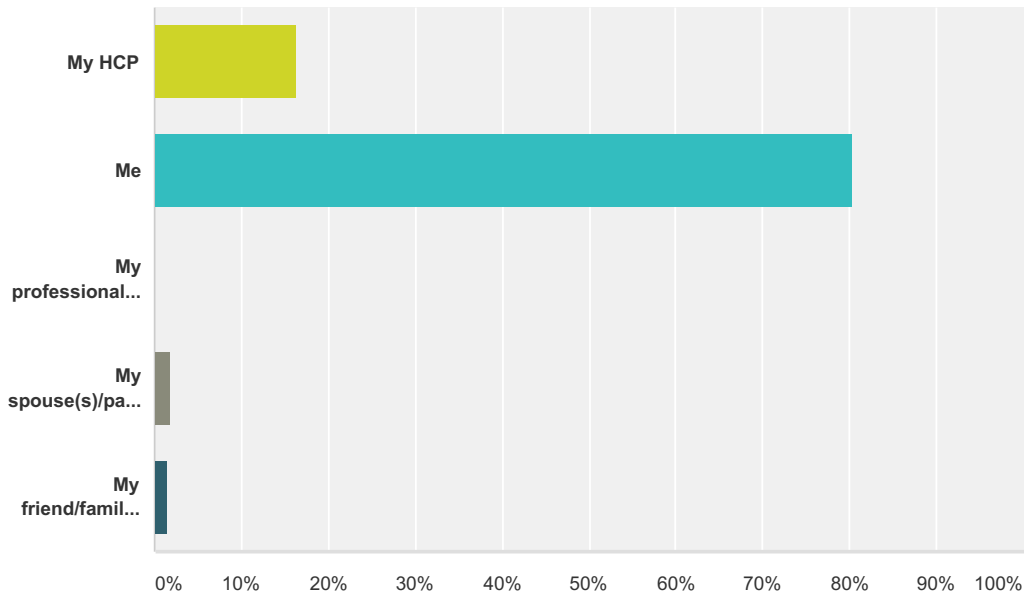

Q9 When Quality of Life (QOL) issues are discussed in an appointment, who usually brings it up first?

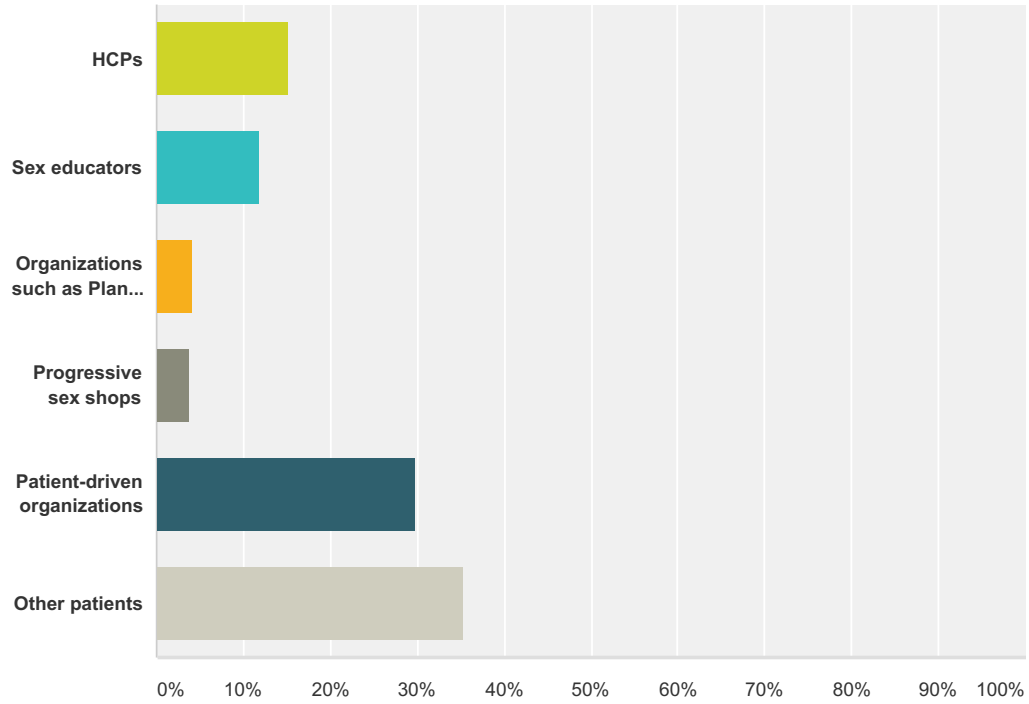
